## ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN

### Raise-up of Pandemic situation and Virtual learning approach:

As we know that the pandemic situation became vilest on the 4th week of April 2021, for which all educational institution notified to remain close for certain period. Hence, looking towards the welfare of students and their career, permission given for the virtual class and this platform including making attendance, attending classes, connecting on video conferences, joining Zoom classrooms. This platform also

has all necessary information about classes, weekly timetables, teaching-learning resources, and curriculum overviews to attend the classes. However, online class was not always supportive due to poor internet connection, yet it was only one effective source for conducting lecture and being cooperative for students.



## Dissertation writing/Agency placements of MSW students:

4th semester students prepare dissertation under the guidance of respective supervisors. The faculties of MSW discipline orient them on the process of writing the dissertation. They explain the style of writing the certificate, preface/foreword, acknowledgement, Table of contents, abbreviations, and finally the Summary of findings with recommendations. The students are also oriented on writing the framework of Bibliography and appendix section. They are encouraged to choose the topic of dissertation. However, students who will face difficulty to choose

a topic are asked to consult their respective supervisors for topic selection. This is one of the important parts of curriculum which strengthen and enhance the theoretical, experimental and exploratory ideas of students. Similarly, students of 3rd semester MSW are placed with different development organizations to get an overview of NGO governance, project management etc. They gain practical knowledge on NGO functioning and the types of activities are undertaken by different agencies. They consolidate the field visit reports which are evaluated by the examiners.

## Final semester examination of 2019-21 students

The Final semester examination of 2019-21 held on the month of September, 2021 on online mode and the result of this examination for both MSW & MAJMC (2019-21) batch students

was published on 17th January, 2022. Total numbers of 47 students were post graduated in both MSW & MAJMC courses.



## Campaigning for new session and new enrollments:

For the 2021-23 sessions, the admission programme has started up from October, 2021 and ended up in January 2022. Initially, campaign had started as per the action plan of meeting to visit nearest graduation colleges and

having contact over phone calls. We also started our campaign on online mode like Facebook post, whatsapp text and push message.

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Thereafter hoarding is also pasted in crowded areas of Dhenkanal and Angul Bus stand as well as visited different Colleges for admission like Sundargarh, Anugul, Gajapati, Kandhamal, Rayagada and Dhenkanal
