Anti- Raging committee


Anti Sexual harassment committee

ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN

Examinations and Academic affairs

Mid semester Examination of 1st Semester (2021-23 batch)

The mid semester examination of 1st semester from 2021-23 batch was held during the month of may, 2022. Examination was conducted as per the guideline given by Utkal University of Culture. According to the notification of UUC, the mid semester examination for both MSW and MAJMC 1st





semester was held from 19/05/2022 to 21/05/2022. A total number of 59 students were attended the examination.

1st and 3rd semester examination of MSW & MJMC students (2021-23 & 2020-22 batch):

The 1st semester examination for the 2021-23batch and 3rd semester examination for 2020-22 batchwasconducted as per the notification of UUC from 11/11/2022 to 23/11/2022. A total number of 90students attended the examination. The examination was conducted smoothly as per the rule and regulations of Utkal University of Culture. Observer/external for theory and practical paper were assigned by UUC

Mid Semester Examination of 2nd and 4th Semester (2021-23 & 2020-22 batch):

The mid semester examination of 2nd and 4th Semester (2021-23 & 2020-22 batch) was held during the month of March, 2023. Examination was conducted as per the guideline given by Utkal University of Culture. According to the notification of UUC, the mid semester examination for both the batch was held from 06/03/2023 to 11/03/2023. A total number of 85 students from both the batches were attended the examination.

Dissertation writing of MSW 4th semester students (2020-22 batch):

4th semester students of 2020-22 batch prepare dissertation under the guidance of respective supervisors. The faculties of MSW discipline orient them on the process of writing the dissertation. They explain the style of writing the certificate, preface/foreword, acknowledgement, Table of contents, abbreviations, and finally the Summary of findings with recommendations. The students are also oriented on writing the framework of Bibliography and appendix section. They are encouraged to choose the topic of dissertation. However, students who will face difficulty to choose a topic are asked to consult their respective supervisors for topic selection. This is one of the important parts of curriculum which strengthen and enhance the theoretical, experimental and exploratory ideas of students.





Online meeting on Implementation of NEP 2020

On 16thapril, 2022, a online meeting was organized by Vice chancellor of Utkal university on implementation on National education Policy, 2020. NSJS also participated in this online meeting. Around 149 colleges were participated in this virtual meeting.

Fieldwork and Rural Camp of 1st semester students (2021-23 batch)



Students of MSW 1st semester conduct their field work on the month of June for seven day in nearby villages like kusupada, Godisahi and Kanteikolia. They went and had interaction with the villagers to know about their lifestyle, source of livelihood, education facility, electricity facility etc. They also visited Anganwadi centre and

Primary school to meet with school students and teachers to get depth knowledge about the lifestyle of tribal people. Students of this batch also have Rural Camp in their 2nd Semester syllabus. The Rural camp conducted on the month of March 2023, for seven days in Khajuria and Gajibania Community. They went



and stay at that community for seven days and know about the lifestyle, source of livelihood, education facility, health facility etc. about these communities.

Campaigning for new session and new enrollments:

Awareness program on gender based violence:

NSJS, along with the NYSASDRI Family Counseling Centre, organized an awareness programme on genderbased violence against women and girls on December 6, 2022, in K.P. High School, Govindpur, to celebrate the "16day activism period to create awareness on gender-based violence", which focused on creating awareness among all the school's students about genderbased violence, legal provisions, and various opportunities available for them to become economically independent and self-reliant. All the staff of NSJS



went to K.P. High School and organized a meeting among 9th and 10th grade students. A debate competition was also organized for the students and prize was distributed to the winners. The entire faculty at NSJS and the principal of K.P. High School gave speeches about gender-based violence and the role of women in our society.

Community projects and community research:

Students of the Social Work and Journalism departments mostly work with the community during their concurrent fieldwork, and they practise the theories by including themselves in the community and their social problems.
